Brother Thomas Lawrence Greer elected for leadership in the Brotherhood of St. Gregory

Thomas Greer, a member of St. Ann's, was elected the Second Minister Provincial for Province IV of the Brotherhood of St. Gregory on July 21. He was voted by simple majority of the First and Life Professed members.

As Second Minister Provincial, Thomas is responsible for coordinating, facilitating, and overseeing all activities that occur within his Province. Thomas will be responsible for conducting quiet day retreats at least every six months to enhance the spiritual life of the community; responsible for dealing with all administrative matters and problems within his Province; and assists the Director of Vocations by making follow-up contacts within his Province as directed.

As Minister Provincial he also receives quarterly Ember tide reports from the Brothers and those in formation and offers guidance, advice, and lends support to his Province. Other duties include communicating all decisions regarding membership to postulants, novices, and professed members; and responsibility for all official visits to the parishes of novices who are nearing the end of the novitiate.

We give thanks for Thomas' vocation and his ministry to St. Ann's and the Brotherhood of St. Gregory.

Adult Sunday Christian Education Offerings

Journey to the Common Good

Based on the book by Walter Brueggeman

October 30, November 6 and 13

Leader: Tom Hardin

On Sunday, October 30th, the Adult Christian Education class begins the first of three Sunday sessions on this topic by Old Testament scholar Dr. Brueggeman. His new book of the same title offers three intriguing ways to reflect on the meaning of the Common Good.

Session one will consider Israel's escape from slavery to the Promised Land by comparing a culture of scarcity to one of abundance and challenges of practicing neighborliness. The hopes and fears of moving from a slave mentality to the anxiety of embracing freedom are raised.

Session two will consider how a community is shaped by the oppressive power of Pharaoh's regime versus the holy power of God's response to the human cry.

Session three will consider whether the Book of Isaiah and its sustained focus on the place and hope of Jerusalem can be a metaphor for today's urban crisis.

Members can read the book 'The Journey to the Common Good.' It is a short book and can be ordered on Amazon.com.

Bible Study The Wired Word

November 20 – December 18

Rick Britton will lead a bible study based on this dynamic curriculum that has grown in popularity and used by many denominations. It is not based on the Revised Common Lectionary (the lessons read during worship). Rather the 'Wired Word' focuses on studying scriptures using relevant current events and applying them to everyday life. Another unique aspect is sending participants an email a few days before each class that includes a description of the event for discussion, questions for reflection and discussion, bible references and a list of additional material to read on the topic. Anyone can benefit from the class without getting these emails.

The Ecclesiastical Trial Court on which he served is now the Disciplinary Board. A plan to inform clergy and laity about the changes to Title IV will be implemented in the near future.
